Bereavement Counselling

Dr David Seamark, Nurse Margaret Pinnuck and Patient Group Member Meg Pipe had a productive meeting with Catherine Davies who counsels for CRUSE and has also set up a new Bereavement Counselling Service in Axminster called ARC. Currently this is for Axminster patients and is funded by the Axminster Care Service (charity). We have agreed to revisit this idea in 2007 to see if we can extend the service to Honiton.

Meg has many hidden talents and has been receiving training in counselling. We are hoping that Meg will be able to undertake the counselling course offered by CRUSE and therefore act as a local resource and a very friendly face!!

Hospiscare have a Bereavement Leaflet which we are also hoping to adapt for use within the surgery.

Flu Vaccinations

We have now started giving Flu injections. There are sessions most days of the week and on Saturday mornings during November. All patients with diabetes, chronic lung & heart disease are eligible including patients over the age of 65. Please make your own appointments at reception, you don't need to wait to be called in.

Honiton Surgery Extension

The Honiton Surgery extension plans have now gone in to East Devon District Council and we are hopeful that we will hear something in the next couple of weeks. Once we have planning permission drawings will be put up on the notice board in the waiting room.

Medical Students

Every year the surgery accepts medical students from the Peninsula Medical School in Exeter for teaching placements. This year we are taking four 2nd year students and five 3rd year students. The 2nd year students will be here on various days between October 2006 and June 2007. The 3rd year students will be at the surgery from Tuesday to Friday on weekly attachments also between October 2006 and June 2007. The students will be sitting in with the doctors and nurses clinics during their time at the surgery and posters will be displayed in reception informing you of when and who they will be sitting in with. The students are here to gain clinical experience which is an essential part of their learning. However, if you would like a private consultation with the doctor or nurse please notify reception. Please also feel free to ask the student to leave the room at any point during your consultation.
